Artistic: Beginner through Novice and Adult Silver

Spins: Beginner through Senior and Adult

Compulsory Moves: Beginner through Juvenile & Open Juvenile

Jumps: Beginner through Senior

Open Free Skating: Limited Beginner through Senior and Adult Silver

Free Skate-Test Track Skating: Pre-Preliminary through Senior

Solo Dance: Preliminary thru International

ELIGIBILITY

This event is open to all amateurs who are members with the USFSA for the 2010-2011 seasons.

Competitors may compete at their test level as of October 11, 2010 or one level higher. All events will be
divided into groupings of 8-10 skaters that are grouped according to age, as possible or by the discretion of
the Referee and/or Competition Chair.

In the event of limitations on the size of events, entries with earlier postmarks will receive priority. **No
refunds** will be made after the deadline on October 11, 2010 except as provided by USFSA CR 10.09.
There is a \$25 service charge for returned checks.

FACILITY DIRECTIONS:

From highway 151, exit Highway 33, turn left to Beaver Dam. At the first stoplight by McDonald's, turn right and go through ShopKo frontage road. At the stop signs past ShopKo you will be looking at the family center. Turn right and then a quick left and another left into the parking lot. There are locker rooms for changing, and a well supplied concession stand.

REGISTRATION:

The registration desk will open at approximately 7:30 am on the day of the event and remain open during the competition. It will be located in the lobby area. Be sure to check in 45 minutes before your event. Events may run ahead of time at the discretion of the referee.

PRACTICE ICE:

Practice ice can be purchased in advance by returning the "Practice Ice Form". Purchase practice ice at time of registration is on a first come basis. No phone reservations will be taken for practice ice. Any remaining practice ice may be purchased at the registration desk the morning of the event. Practice Ice generally begins at 6:30 am.

SCRATCHES:

If you must scratch one or more events after checking in, please be considerate of other entrants in your events, and notify the Registration Desk. **NO** refunds will be given after the closing date unless the event is cancelled for lack of participation.

MUSIC:

Each skater must furnish her/his own clearly labeled CD, with competitor's name and event. A duplicate CD should be readily available. **MUSIC MUST BE TURNED IN AT TIME OF REGISTRATION**. Music may be picked up at the registration desk after the event. No music will be mailed after the competition.

AWARDS:

Medals - will be awarded to the top four individual skaters in each flight/event. Awards will be presented off ice, immediately following completion of the event and posting of the results. Photographer will be taking professional photographs of groups and individuals.

Team Trophies – will be awarded to the top 4 Skating Clubs based on points given per finishes in the individual events. Points will be awarded as follows: 8 Points / First Place, 5 Points / Second Place, 3 Points / Third Place and 1 Point / Fourth Place. (if home club has the same amount of skaters or less skaters then any other incoming club we will not be excluded.)

EVENTS TO BE OFFERED:

Skaters may compete at their test level as of October 11, 2010 or one level higher.

ARTISTIC IMPRESSION

Artistic Freeskate skaters will be judged on composition and presentation. Artistic feeling and presentation are stressed more than the technical difficulty in these events. Vocal or instrumental music is the skater's choice, but must be appropriate. Clothing may be theatrical, but all other US Figure Skating rules apply. **Handheld props will be allowed, but they may not touch the ice surface. No scenery is allowed.** Judging will be based on originality, creativity, and musical interpretation according to the following criteria:

Composition: Conformity of choreography with music and utilization of the ice surface in harmonious composition of the program as a whole.

Presentation: Style originality and expression of the character of the music.

Groupings are based on the skater's freestyle test level and may be divided by age or draw, but NOT by gender. Groups may be combined where there are insufficient entries at a particular level.

SPIN SKATING EVENTS

Skaters may enter at their test level or one level higher. All levels will be skated on half ice surface. Spins shall be skated in a SIMPLE PROGRAM with no extra or repeated elements. Connecting moves and short sequences of footwork may be used between spins and will not be judged.

COMPULSORY MOVES EVENTS

Eligibility is the same as for Free Skating events. Spins and Artistic events. Compulsory moves are skated without music. The specified moves may be in any order but must be skated exactly. An Axel is a single jump. Connecting steps must be distinguishable from a footwork sequence. **Limited Beginner through Pre-Juvenile will utilize half the ice surface. Juvenile & Open Juvenile events will utilize the entire ice surface.**

JUMP EVENTS

Skaters may enter their test level or one level higher. Beginner through Juvenile levels will be skated on half-ice. Intermediate through Senior levels will be skated on full ice. Jumps should be performed **exactly** as stated. Skaters will be given two opportunities to perform each jump and will be judged on the best one.
