

## Spring 2010 (April 12-May 8)

### Synchronized Skills Class

*Designed to strengthen your Synchro skills as you head into tryouts and the upcoming competitive season.*

Skaters must have passed out of USFS Basic 2 in order to take the Beginner sync camp.

- 3 weeks April 12-April 30
- Classes held on Mon and Wed
- **Class A: Pre-Juvenile and Intermediate Level**
  - 2.5 hours per week
- **Class B: Beginner and Preliminary Level**
  - 2 hours per week

*Current SCIS sync skaters will register for the class that corresponds to the team level they skated on in the 2009-10 season. SCIS club members who were not on a sync team in 2009-10 and out of club skaters will be placed in a class based on skating level, moves level and sync experience. They will contact sync committee for placement. See below.*

**Cost for the class will be \$20.**

### Synchronized Skating Tryouts

Sunday, May 2, Monday, May 3 and Wednesday May 5

Open Tryouts

*Looking to field the following teams: Novice/Intermediate, Open Juvenile/Pre-Juvenile, Preliminary, and Beginner*

- **Sunday, May 2:** 3 hours, cost \$30  
SCIS skaters on a Pre-Juvenile or Intermediate team in 2009-10 **and** skaters who have passed pre-juvenile moves or higher
- **Monday, May 3:** 2 hours, cost \$20  
SCIS skaters on a Preliminary or Pre-Juvenile team in 2009-10
- **Wednesday, May 5:** 2 hours, \$20  
SCIS skaters on a Beginner or Preliminary team in 2009-10

SCIS Preliminary skaters will come 2 days (Monday and Wed) and SCIS Pre-Juvenile skaters will come 2 days (Sunday and Monday)

*Skaters who were not on a SCIS synchronized team in 2009-10 or are out of club skaters but would like to tryout should contact Julie Sena 356-1424 or [JulieBSena@aol.com](mailto:JulieBSena@aol.com) for tryout dates. Skaters must have passed out of USFS Basic 2 in order to tryout.*

## **Team Placement:**

Beginning a day or two after tryouts, invitation letters/emails will go out to the skaters. We will do this from the highest level team down. Invites will go out to the highest level team and then they will have 2-3 days to sign the commitment and make the **commitment payment of \$100**. When that team is set the letters will be sent to the next team down and they will have 2-3 days to respond (sign commitment and make payment). And on down the line until the teams are all set. If skaters on a team do not commit and this significantly affects the structure of the team, a division change may be made. Letters/emails will then be sent to all of the skaters affected and we will ask for another commitment for this new team level.

This allows the skaters to know where they will be placed prior to making a commitment and to make an informed decision. The Sync Committee will know who they have and if some skaters don't commit then we have an opportunity to restructure a team without disrupting teams that are already set.

We plan to have all our teams set and ready to go by the end of May.
